BCSD vote on May 17 for budget, BOE candidates

Beacon City School District registered voters can go to the polls on May 17 and vote on the 2022-23 budget and for Board of Education candidates. The polls are open from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m.

"I am honored to be the Superintendent of the Beacon City School District and I am thrilled to be finishing my fifth year in the position. I am incredibly proud of the many ways the Beacon City School District community stepped up to help our students during these challenging past two years," commented Beacon City School District Superintendent Dr. Matthew Landahl. Dr. Landahal noted that the budget is "at the tax cap and not exceeding it." He also stated "[t]he tax levy increase is 3.7% and the budget increase is 2.2%."

According to Landahl, the school budgets over the past several years have supported the following:

• Small class sizes at the elementary level

• Instrumental music beginning in the fourth grade

• Expanded Pre-k programs in the

• A wide range of course offerings at Beacon High School including seven AP (Advanced Placement) courses and seven Dutchess Community College courses

• A strong athletics program with many offerings from modified to the varsity level

• Člubs and extracurriculars at all

levels of school

• 1:1 Chromebook initiative for all of the students

"Our proposed 2022-2023 budget maintains all of our past budget accomplishments while adding five teaching positions to further support student mental health, additional coursework at the high school and middle school, and the expansion of a full-time pre-k class at each elementary school. Our budget priorities are developed throughout the year with the BCSD Board of Education with a strong focus on student and community needs," said Landahl.

"If the budget vote does not pass, the

"If the budget vote does not pass, the district would have to implement a contingency budget. The contingency budget would force us to make approximately \$1,700,000 of cuts across all areas of the district and it would have a negative impact on the student experience in our district," said Landahl.

There is also a bus proposition for three 72 passenger buses, three 20 passenger vans for a total of \$546,000, which will be financed over five years to match State Aid (58.5%), according to District information.

There are four candidates running for Board of Education. Voters choose to elect four members to the Board of Education as follows:

• Three members to the Board of Education for three-year terms (commencing July 1, and expiring June 30, 2025)

• One member for a two-year and six-week term (commencing May 17 and expiring on June 30, 2024)

After Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro announced his intention to run for Congress against incumbent Democrat Antonio Delgado, to represent New York's expansive 19th District in Washington, D.C., it seemed fairly straightforward as to the next steps.

If Molinaro lost to Delgado in November, he would return to Poughkeepsie to serve out his County Exec term until 2023. If he won, Deputy County Executive William O'Neil would take over and complete Molinaro's term as per the Dutchess County Charter.

Rarely do things go as planned, however, as we saw last week.

know us on a personal level and know the resources that are available for them no matter what the situation is. It's educational and informative. It's also a great opportunity for people to receive a free bicycle helmet for their children, get your car seats inspected and if deemed unsafe for your child, it will be replaced for free."

Speaking of free, there will be free face painting, balloons, Teddy bears from the Teddy Bear Clinic, said Cortes.

"There is opportunity to vaccinate ages 12+. Dr. Papish from MidHudson Regional Hospital emergency room will be overlooking the vaccination pod and will answer any questions as well as performing a CME on site. In safe weather conditions, a helicopter will be landing and who doesn't love a helicopter! There is a long list of attendees, and you definitely have to check it out," remarked Cortes.

"I have been coordinating this event for the past six years. Unfortunately, when we started to thrive, we ended up losing two years due to COVID. I just hope that people can come out, have a good time get to know your local first responders. EMS workers, police officers, corrections officers, domestic violence teams, human trafficking teams, Metro-North Railroad safety teams, doctors, nurses, opioid awareness teams you name it," said Cortes.

Also expected during the event, according to Cortes, the New Hamburg Fire Department with its safe house, which is a trailer filled with smoke so people can practice going through a house in the event there's a fire they know how to get in and out safely.

There will be a "lock gate" for those who lost somebody who is struggling with addiction. Cortes explained that one can bring a lock to lock on the gate that will go back to Grandma's Garden.

"Grandma is a woman whose grandson lost his life due to addiction who has made it her mission to reach out and help others," she explained.

The Elks will be selling food and an ice cream truck will be on site as well.



Delgado dropped out of the race and will resign his seat in Congress after being named as the new New York State Lieutenant Governor to join Governor Kathy Hochul in Albany. That follows the arrest and resignation of former Lt. Governor Brian Benjamin.

"I need someone by my side who I can rely on for wisdom, guidance, and advice, and that person must be willing to put New Yorkers first and place a high priority on delivering results, rather than playing partisan politics," Hochul said. "They must believe in hard work, be a team player, and treat everyone with respect. And most important, they must be someone that New Yorkers trust and have absolute confidence in. So today, I'm really proud to say, I found that person."

Delgado said that after two years of COVID, New Yorkers need to reconnect and heal together.

"New Yorkers deserve a Lieutenant Governor who's working day and night to make lives better for working people and their families. Upstate, downstate, it does not matter. We all want the same thing: security, family, opportunity," he said.

State Assemblymember Didi Barrett praised Hochul's choice of Delgado.

"I have had the great honor to partner with Congressman Antonio Delgado over the past four years to advocate for our farmers, veterans and other shared constituents," Barrett said. "His thoughtful and compassionate approach to public service will make him an outstanding Lieutenant Governor for the State of New York, and a terrific partner for Governor Kathy Hochul."

NYS Senator Sue Serino said, "The way this process has unfolded was undemocratic and unfortunate, however, it is always a positive for our local community when someone from the Hudson Valley takes on a position where they have the ability to help elevate our concerns and directly address our needs. I hope that the Lt. Governor stays true to his Hudson Valley roots and works with us to help move our community forward."

Democrats' next move

What was left unsaid however, including by Delgado, is the 800-pound gorilla in the room – who will run in Delgado's place as the Democratic candidate for Congressional District 19?

"Since the contours of the new CD-19 are still unknown, we are currently involved in internal discussions. For the moment, I am confident that a strong candidate like Ulster County Executive Pat Ryan, who is considering a run, will step forward and deliver a

Democratic victory come November," Julie Shiroishi, Dutchess County Democratic Chair, said in a statement to the Southern and Northern Dutchess News.

Ryan and New York State Sen. Michelle Hinchey – daughter of the late U.S. Congressman Maurice Hinchey of Saugerties – are the two names that have run through the rumor mill as potential opponents for Molinaro for the 19th District. Neither has confirmed a possible run. But neither has denied it either publicly.

In fact, Ryan went so far as to post on his Twitter feed that "I am now seriously considering how best to continue serving my community and constituents."

Not only are Democrats scrambling to find a viable opponent to run against Molinaro for the Congressional seat, but the succession plan for Dutchess County Executive is not so clear-cut any longer.

Hochul indicated last week she will call for a special election (Aug. 23) for the 19th District given the circumstances. And Molinaro is on something of a deadline now – if he resigns as Dutchess County Executive before August 8, it's possible voters could be going to the polls this coming November to elect his replacement instead of in November of 2023. State Elections law calls for any vacancy occurring three months prior to a general election are authorized to be filled at a general election.

In all likelihood, Molinaro will not resign prior to August 8 and O'Neil will take over through the 2023 election cycle. O'Neil is a former businessman, but does have background in county politics. He was an assistant to former Dutchess County Executive William Steinhaus and later became Molinaro's chief of staff before becoming Deputy County Executive in 2012.

That doesn't appear likely, however.

In the meantime, Molinaro is sitting back suddenly in the driver's seat with the developments in the Congressional race.

"Delgado's decision to resign mid-way through the election cycle shows that he knows he would lose in November because of the incredible momentum our campaign has built. Ultimately, the Congressman knows that he and his party are responsible for the crime wave, out of control inflation, and illegal attempts to draw themselves safe districts," Molinaro said in a statement. "The district lines may change. My opponent may change. But what won't change is why I'm running: For us. For you. ... We were going to win against Delgado and we'll win the special election when it's announced. We aren't changing course, we are full speed ahead.'

\$43,000 grant to repurpose baseball field in Poughkeepsie for Girls Softball program

The Town of Poughkeepsie was awarded a \$43,000 grant from T-Mobile. Poughkeepsie was one of 25 small towns to receive one of the grants, called Hometown Grants. The grant will be used to repurpose one of the town's baseball fields into a softball field. The repurposing will accommodate the Town of Poughkeepsie Girls Little League Softball program. A ceremony was held on April 23 to acknowledge the award.

"The Town of Poughkeepsie is grateful to receive this grant from T-Mobile," said Poughkeepsie Town Supervisor Jon Jay Baisley, stated in a press release. "This will play an important role in the upgrade to this park and future plans for the town park infrastructure. Thank you for awarding this to the Town of Poughkeepsie."

"We are delighted to receive the T-Mobile Hometown Grant. The grant is focused on revitalizing community spaces and we are the only project in the state of NY to receive the grant this year. The grant funding will be used at Stanley Still Park on Jackson Rd. to construct a new softball field for the primary use of Girls Softball. The Girls Softball program is vital to the health and well-being of the youth population in Poughkeepsie and we are committed to improving the opportunities afforded to the youth in our community," said Janet McHugh, Town of

Poughkeepsie Recreation Director. "Research shows that by the age of 14, girls are dropping out of sports at twice the rate of boys which is an alarming statistic. This project will allow the program to grow and offer more young girls the opportunity to remain in the program. The project will also include expansion of a walking path in order to make the new field fully accessible. The fields at Stanley Still are not solely used by Girls Softball however, but also by local Senior Citizen Softball Leagues and as an overflow facility for the local baseball leagues. So, the park and this project have dual purpose."

"With the proposed revisions planned for the fields at Poughkeepsie's Stanley Still Park, we foresee positive experiences, enjoyment and smiles from all the young athletes in the local community. T-Mobile's excited to support the town of Poughkeepsie with this Hometown Grant, and looking forward to seeing how this project impacts children throughout the community in the future," Shante Newman, with T-Mobile, told Beacon Free Press.





Creation of NYS cabinet-level veterans agency a 'huge step forward'

Recently, much of the water cooler conversation (or "scuttlebutt" to all my sailors out there) among our local veterans has focused on the potential closure of the VA Hospital at Castle Point, so it's easy to overlook other newsworthy items that might impact the lives of our heroes. For example, after a long debate in Albany, our Assemblymember Didi Barrett (D-Dutchess/Columbia) reports that her legislation to create a new Department of Veterans Services for New York State was included in the 2022-23 state budget. Now, this might not sound very important to the casual observer, but for the veteran community in New York, this is a huge step forward.

"I fought to include this legislation to create a one-stop Department of Veterans' Services because I know New York State can and should do better for our servicemen and women," said Barrett, who is the Chair of the Veterans Affairs Committee in the New York State Assembly.

This is much more than a simple name change. The old Division of Veterans Services was established in 1945 to help World War II veterans make the transition home. But it's never been a cabinet-level agency. Surprised? I was too! I think we can all agree that veterans should be represented at the highest level of our state government; but unfortunately, that has not been the case until now. Having a cabinet-level official fighting for our veterans is welcome news, for sure.

This change sure sounds like a "no-brainer," doesn't it? But I know how long a battle it has been to get this legislation into the state budget, because it was more than two years ago when Assemblymember Barrett asked me to address her colleagues in the Assembly on how much this change could truly help our veterans. It was a great experience for me, discussing real issues like veteran mental health and homelessness with our elected leaders in the halls of justice, but at the time, I had no idea how long it would take to make this wonderful idea a reality.

"The establishment of this new department is a critical next step to ensuring our veterans and their families receive the benefits and services they have earned in the most effective and accessible way possible," continued Barrett. I couldn't agree more, and it's a shame that it has taken this long for such a meaningful change to occur for our heroes in New York State. This is the first time in more than 50 years that New York State has created a new state agency, the last being when the Department of Environmental Conservation was established way back in 1970.

Furthermore, Barrett's office reports that only 17% of New York's veteran population are accessing their earned benefits, in part due to the decentralized distribution of these resources. According to Assemblymember Barrett, this new legislation will centralize the benefits and programs meant to support veterans under

the newly created Department of Veterans' Services, making them more readily accessible. That's certainly good news for veterans and their families!

I want to thank Assemblymember Barrett for sharing this positive news, and I would also like to thank her and all those elected leaders in Dutchess County who always try to put our veterans first. This change to a full-fledged Department of Veterans Services might not seem particularly newsworthy at first, but I think it has the potential to pay big dividends in the years to come.

Fishkill board gives ok for town police to send vests to Ukraine

"The people of Ukraine are under constant attack and need as much help as they can get," remarked Rina Bleyzer O'Malley, Director of Communications for DAAR Charitable Foundation, via

The Fishkill Town Board passed a resolution donating police vests to Ukrainians.. The donations will be made to DAAR, which is a U.S. 501(c)(3) nonprofit, run by volunteers. The resolution was passed during the April 20 meeting held in the Fishkill Town Hall.

"The Town of Fishkill has a bunch of old vests, police vests, and the police department wants to donate [them] to Ukraine," said Town of Fishkill Supervisor Ozzy Alba. "I think it's a great idea.

Albra noted "even though they're old, they're still effective."

According to the resolution the police department has 30 bullet-proof vests and assorted panel covers which have been taken out of service and deemed obsolete by modern law enforcement standards.

"The Town of Fishkill Police Department has established a collection site at the police department for defensive and medical equipment and supplies. These items will be donated to provide humanitarian aid in defense of the people of Ukraine," said Town of Fishkill Police Chief Keith Dworkin. "Town of Fishkill Police Lieutenant, Patrick Cadden, who initiated the project and is conducting the groundwork, has identified thirty sets of surplus TFPD body armor. With help from the Fishkill Town Board, we were able to turn this surplus equipment, which would have remained in storage, into valuable protective equipment for donation."

O'Malley said, "DAAR Charitable Foundation is working to get badly-needed protective gear to Ukrainian civilian volunteers and first responders, and we are so grateful to the Town of Fishkill for providing these items."

Dworkin noted, "We are reaching out to all police agencies in the Hudson Valley to donate any equipment and supplies they would like, to aid in this effort."

The resolution stated, "Accordingly, it is proposed that the Town Board declare the used bullet-proof vests and assorted panel and covers surplus and dispose of them by providing them to the DAAR Charitable Foundation program for sending assistance materials to Ukraine."

Discussion held about recommendations in VA report about Castle Point

Memorial Park in Beacon was the recent site of a discussion of the report released earlier this year by the VA, in which the report suggests Castle Point be closed and a new facility be built in Fishkill. Organizer Dennis Pavelock read information from a previous meeting that was held in Poughkeepsie recently during a forum.

The Department of Veterans Affairs released its Asset and Infrastructure Review report March 14. The report recommends possibly closing Castle Point VA Medical Center (VAMC) for the purpose of making upgrades. The AIR Commission will conduct public hearings. It will then submit its own recommendations in 2023 to the president for further review, according to the VA.

Assemblyman Jonathan Jacobson and a representative for NYS Senator Sue Serino were present.

"I've been on top of this issue since it came out," said Jacobson, who noted he rallied outside Castle Point with U.S. Senator Charles Schumer (D-NY) in March. Jacobson said veterans and the community have to "stay vigilant" and keep this issue alive.

Pavelock said, "Castle Point is centrally located" for a lot of veterans in the area.

"There have been no announcements or decisions regarding any VA facilities closing, anywhere including Castle Point. VA was required by law to conduct a series of market assessments under the VA MIS-SION Act to examine future demand for health care services among the Veteran population, which is projected to change in size and location over the next decade. It is important to note that any recommendations to the upcoming AIR Commission are just recommendations," a spokesperson for Castle Point stated previously.



It hasn't been luck at all.

Rumfield has shown a sweet stroke, hits for power and average, and prides himself on defense. And he's pretty good on the base-paths as well, having stolen three bases in five attempts.

Renegades end road trip with doubleheader split

The Hudson Valley Renegades ended a two-week road trip by splitting a double-header on Sunday with the Jersey Shore BlueClaws at ShoreTown Ballpark.

The Renegades won the opener 2-0, while the BlueClaws took the nightcap 4-0.

In the opener, T.J. Sikkema made his first professional pitching appearance since July 21, 2019 and was perfect in 2.0 innings. The left-hander, who was the 38th overall pick in the 2019 First-Year Player Draft by the Yankees, retired all six batters he faced, striking out three and throwing 26 pitches, 20 for strikes.

The Renegades took the lead in the top of the second after Ben Brown walked the bases loaded and Aldenis Sanchez delivered a two-run single to left. That was one of just two hits in the game for Hudson Valley, but it was all the Renegades would need.

Edgar Barclay (3-2) spun 3.2 shutout innings of relief, striking out five and allowing just one hit. Tanner Myatt closed out the win with 1.1 scoreless innings to earn his first save. Sikkema, Barclay and

Myatt combined to one-hit the BlueClaws, the second one-hitter of the year thrown by Hudson Valley.

In the nightcap, the BlueClaws took the lead in the bottom of the first against right-hander Blas Castano. An RBI single for Jared Carr scored Ethan Wilson to give Jersey Shore a 1-0 lead.

The BlueClaws tacked on two more in the second and another in the third off Castao (0-3) to take a 4-0 advantage. Only two of the runs allowed by the righthander in the game were earned, as he struck out three and walked two.

Hudson Valley threatened throughout the game, mounting a bases-loaded oneout threat in the fourth, and a second-andthird, no-out opportunity in the sixth, but was unable to score both times.

The Renegades combined to steal six bases in the doubleheader, and have now swiped a Minor League Baseball-high 69 bases this season.

The Renegades, now 14-12 overall, were scheduled to return to Dutchess Stadium on Tuesday to begin a series with the Aberdeen IronBirds.

Visiting Somerset and getting players settled

Every week, Hudson Valley Renegades President Steve Gliner sits down with reporter Rich Thomaselli to discuss the team in particular, and minor league baseball in general.

So the last few weeks we talked about opening the season, opening the home season, getting Dutchess Stadium ready ... what did you do with these last two weeks with the team on the road?

(Laughs) I took my first two days off in 37 days. But I quantify that by saying, by definition that just means I'm not going into the office. Because even if I'm not at the Stadium I'm always working. There are always moving parts and we have to be available to do some things. But my wife and I actually took advantage of the weather early in the week and had a chance to go over to Brotherhood Winery in Orange County and it was a pretty relaxing day.

Find anything that you liked?

Yeah, we found a couple of things!

Valley They have this chocolate wine. It's kind of like a Bailey's Irish Cream, it has that consistency to it instead of traditional wine, but it was great. It's my new favorite. And I'll say no more (laughs).

Did you get a chance to get the staff some time off as well?

Oh yeah, we gave everybody a couple of days off during the week as well as last weekend. It was a busy time leading up to the season. I mean, 37 straight days is a long time. You have to pace yourself, and it's important for people to decompress.

I saw that you also had a chance to make the short trip down to Jersey to see the Yankees' Double A franchise in Somerset. What was that like?

Nice. Really, really nice. I've been meaning to get down there and check out their ballpark. It's a great ballpark. Patrick (McVerry), their general manager who I have gotten to know over Zoom, was a great host and I got to see some of the spaces and see some of the



things they've done. I think they seat 6,100. Their concourse is open to the seating bowl, kind of like Yankee Stadium, so it's nice.

So a month into the season and we're already seeing quite a bit of roster movement, some guys being promoted and others being sent down. What's that like for you to get everybody settled and squared away?

For me it's like breathing oxygen. There's an internal checklist of things to get ready to do. We work in conjunction with the Yankees, and they play a part in getting these arrangements set up. I think one of the best things to come out of the new

agreement was that players no longer have to find, or pay for, housing on their own. The Major League club takes care of that now (the Renegades stay at a local hotel when they are home). It's just one of those things the players no longer have to concern themselves with, one less thing they have to worry about. Then we take care of everyhingelse – the bats, the balls, the uniforms, the other clothing ... we make sure they are integrated into the Renegades family.

RTDC volunteers help three residents with repairs on National Rebuilding Day

Three Dutchess County residents received assistance with home repairs by volunteers with Rebuilding Together Dutchess County (RTDC) on National Rebuilding Day, the last Saturday of April.

However, "in 2014, I got cancer" she explained, "and my health started to go downhill and my capabilities went with it." Combined with the medical bills and more money going out than coming in, she hasn't been able to keep up with the home repairs as she used to, or would like to.

For Bob, 87, who was also served, these repairs mean he can stay in his home. "I now know I will be here forever. That's what I wanted to do, stay here. When I die, I want to die here. Not in a hospital, not in a home, but here." In addition to other repairs throughout the home, chairlifts were installed so Bob can navigate the split-level home safely and the bathroom door was turned into a pocket door to make it wider to allow him to walk in safely with his rolling walker.

"The repairs we provide on National Rebuilding Day, and throughout the year, are life-changing, life-saving repairs for our neighbors in need," says Darcy McCourt, the newly appointed Executive Director of RTDC. "Our services ensure homeowners like Alice and Bob can live independently in safe and healthy homes."

This National Rebuilding Day was special to RTDC because it is their 30th year serving Dutchess County homeowners and it was a return to their roots. The day marked the first-time volunteers were out in the community helping their neighbors since the start of the pandemic.

Program Manager, Wyeth Drummond, felt the significance of what it all meant. "The last few years have been hard for everyone, but National Rebuilding Day reminded us how important the work we do is, what it truly means to those we assist and that together we can truly make a difference."

CDC lists Dutchess as medium-risk community

With active reported cases rising nearly 50 percent from last week, and other metrics headed in the wrong direction, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is categorizing Dutchess as a county with a medium risk of community transmission. Until this past week, Dutchess was considered a county with a low risk of transmission.

The CDC outlines the following guidelines for medium-risk communities:

- If you are at high risk for severe illness, talk to your healthcare provider about whether you need to wear a mask and take other precautions;

- Stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccines;

- Get tested if you have symptoms.






